RJFC hosted the Y11/12 Male competition Elimination finals this year, as well as the rescheduled, Y9/10 Female Elimination final, after their original game was abandoned due to a storm.

Four of our own teams reached the finals this season: Y8, Y9/10 Females, Y10 Gold, and Y11/12 Females. All teams showed strong Tiger Spirit and represented the club admirably.

The Y8 team battled the harsh weather conditions and narrowly missed the title in an exciting grand final, finishing as runners-up.

Notably, the **Y9/10 girls became the Club's first All-Female Premiers** in an outstanding effort! Hannah Floyd was named Best on Ground and was an absolute superstar on the day, as were all her team mates. Championship Club Program



Following a state-wide launch by WA Football, the Championship Club Program was introduced. This initiative is designed to strengthen club governance, improve volunteer management, and enhance operational effectiveness throughout community football organisations.

The Committee has dedicated considerable time and effort behind the scenes throughout the year, working diligently on the program, and as a result, Roleystone Junior Football Club is now a top-tier **Premiership Level Club** within the Championship Club Program.

National Road Safety Week



As part of a new initiative our Club President Samantha had been working on for a long time along with the newly introduced Tom’s Law, in honour of her son Tom, we saw the introduction of National Road Safety Week in May. Clubs were invited to participate in a round dedicated to road safety awareness, wear yellow armbands and take a pledge.

WA Football embraced this initiative and helped by using their platform and the influence of community football — to educate, empower and encourage players, coaches, volunteers, and families to make safe choices behind the wheel.

RJFC was invited to take part in an important pilot workshop lead by Clayton Anderson from the WA Football Integrity Department. The aim is to assess the potential benefits (and risk mitigation) of education in the following key areas:

- Social Media
- Discrimination and Vilification

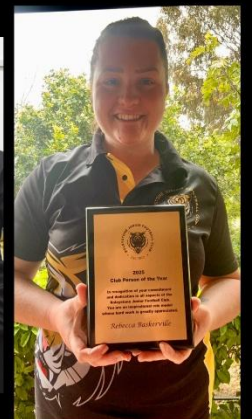

PRESIDENTS REPORT

It's been another incredible season at Roleystone Junior Football Club, and I'm proud to share some of the highlights from this year.

Our Auskick girls only Wednesday night program was a huge success and our Year 2 graduation night games with Kelmscott and half-time curtain raisers with our year 10 Black and Year 11/12 Female teams were fantastic opportunities to showcase our young talent.

This year we introduced a new constitution in accordance with WA Football and Associations Online guidelines and I'm pleased to report that we also worked on achieving the Top Tier Premiership Club level in the Champion Clubs Program. We are amongst a small number of clubs in the state to reach this level, so this is a huge achievement for our little club in the hills.

On the facilities front, we saw the start of the renovations to our all inclusive changerooms which is still ongoing with some minor setbacks with the COA, but I'll continue to work with them to reach the outcome we require. We are hoping for completion of the change rooms with our renovated vintage lockers in place for the start of the 2026 season.

We have new honour boards almost completed, which will take pride of place soon.

We've rolled out a new Life Player Policy (including all Old Boys who have played 130+ games for RJFC) and also rolled out new merchandise reflecting our refreshed brand. The rebrand signage is now complete, including a new club sign at the main entrance, which all looks amazing.

This season, we placed a strong emphasis on the wellbeing of our players. Coaches participated in workshops and focus groups on identifying mental health concerns. We held the WA Football vilification pilot program and team discussions, in addition to a road safety focus group for our older teams. These initiatives have strengthened our culture and supported the growth of our players both on and off the field.

On the field, our players achieved some incredible results. We celebrated success at the SF Gala Day, where we were awarded Best Represented Club and received a \$500 voucher.

Four of our RJFC teams made finals. Both our Y11/12 Girls and Y10 Gold Boys played strong games but unfortunately did not progress after their elimination finals.

The Y8's made it to their Grand Final but despite their amazing efforts, narrowly missed out on the win in the final minutes of the game.

In a historical game, our Y9/10 Girls won their Grand Final to become RJFC first ever All-Female team Premiers. Well done girls and Coaching Staff, we are all so proud of you.

We received a \$10,000 electoral pledge from Hugh Jones MLA and the Labour Party, which we are grateful for and will support the many projects and equipment purchases we've had on the go this season.

None of these achievements would have been possible without the tireless efforts of our committee, coaches, managers, volunteers, parents and of course our amazing players.

Thank you for the countless hours you all give to make our club the strong and supportive community it is today and good luck to all the players who have been nominated for development opportunities.

On a Personal note, this report is a little bittersweet for me, as it marks the end of my time as President.

After 26 years with the club, I've made the difficult decision to stand down and move into my next chapter. I say difficult as this club has been such a huge part of my life, through the highs and lowest lows of my life. I've loved finding this special place and sharing quality time with not only my kids but watching other kids grow and shine, making friends, laughing and loving their sport.

I'm also so proud of everything we have accomplished together for the club over the years.

I want to sincerely thank every single person who has been part of my journey here, the support and love when I tragically lost my husband and son, the friendships over the years, the amazing memories and the spirit and echoes of this club will always remain very close to my heart.

I wish the next committee and the entire Roleystone Junior Football Club community, all the very best for the future. The club is in a strong position and I look forward to seeing it continue to grow and thrive.
